Scholar ship sets sail for global education

Ever wanted to traverse the globe while studying the works of Aristotle? Your prayers could well be answered as the world's first 'study ship' is preparing for voyage.

Launched earlier this year by a consortium of six international universities from Australia, China, Morocco, Mexico, Ghana and the US, The Scholar Ship is the world's first study-at-sea programme designed specifically for students across the world. The consortium is delighted to announce today that it will offer a minimum of 50 scholarships to European students for its inaugural voyage in September 2007. Backed by Royal Caribbean Cruises Ltd., The Scholar Ship's semester-long programme will bring together up to 600 undergraduate and postgraduate international students to form a floating transnational learning community focused on intercultural leadership and communication.
