You must have earned (or anticipate earning) a minimum of a bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in Business from a recognized institution prior to the voyage with a 2.7 GPA (Australian). Your complete academic record will be assessed to determine suitability for admission and you should be prepared to succeed in a rigorous academic environment.
