You must have earned (or anticipate earning) a minimum of a bachelor's degree (or equivalent) from a recognized institution prior to the voyage with a 2.5 GPA (Australian). Evidence of English language proficiency is also required if English is not your first language. Please see our [Application Instructions](#) for minimum requirements.

Your complete academic record will be assessed to determine suitability for admission and you should be prepared to succeed in a rigorous academic environment.
